Aims: Development is one of the words which we are familiar. Course content:

The course combines in-class sessions and field practice. The duration of in-class sessions is 5 days. The lecturers are from domestic and abroad, covering a range of multidisciplinary backgrounds including anthropology, ethnology, sociology, political science and economics. The contents of in-class sessions are: Analyzing the concept of study of the works of development theory, comments on development model and development path, questions detailed cases of development, problems like poverty, disasters, etc. which development is facing and basic theories and methods of fieldwork.

The field practice requires residence in one of the 10 ethnic minority villages for a continuation of 10 days. Students will do the fieldwork on development issues under the guidance of 1-2 teachers in each group and complete the investigation report.
